8 SYNOPSIS: This bill makes a supplemental appropriation  
9 from the Education Trust Fund to the Department of  
10 Labor in the amount of \$1,600,000 for the fiscal  
11 year ending September 30, 2016; and makes a  
12 supplemental appropriation from the Education Trust  
13 Fund to the Department of Archives and History in  
14 the amount of \$77,000 for the fiscal year ending  
15 September 30, 2016.

21 To make a supplemental appropriation from the  
22 Education Trust Fund to the Department of Labor in the amount  
23 of \$1,600,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016;  
24 to make a supplemental appropriation from the Education Trust  
25 Fund to the Department of Archives and History in the amount  
26 of \$77,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016.  
27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1                   Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations  
2 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated  
3 \$1,600,000 from the Education Trust Fund to the Department of  
4 Labor for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016. This  
5 appropriation shall be expended for a statewide longitudinal  
6 database to enable the state to efficiently and accurately  
7 manage, analyze and use education data to improve student  
8 learning and outcomes.

9                   Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations  
10 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated  
11 \$77,000 from the Education Trust Fund to the Department of  
12 Archives and History for the fiscal year ending September 30,  
13 2016. This appropriation shall be expended for professional  
14 development and curriculum development for K-12 teachers.

15                   Section 3. This act shall become effective  
16 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or  
17 upon its otherwise becoming law.
